


Responsibility #1

Responsibility #2

Responsibility #3

Always show appreciation by saying "Thank you" for a kind gesture or gift.






Responsibility #7

When we are going to enter an elevator, the school bus, or a doorway, we will wait for others to exit before we enter.






Responsibility #14

Responsibility #15

Responsibility #16

Responsibility #17

Be the best person you can be.






Responsibility #29

Be positive and enjoy life. Some things just aren't worth getting upset over. Keep everything in perspective and focus on the good in life.








Responsibility #32
